

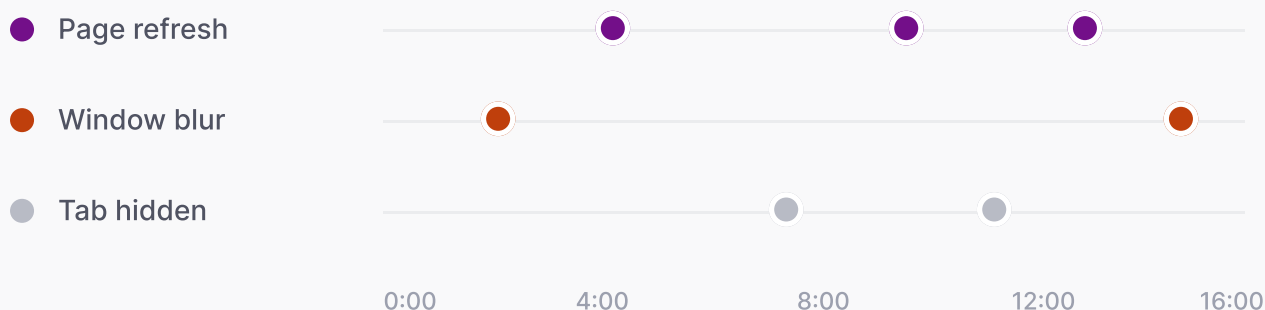
Reading the integrity signals

How to interpret a candidate's session activity log

Candidate B — flagged session

● Suspicious activity detected

3 refreshes · 4 other events · flagged for human review



● No suspicious activity

Candidate A — clean session. No refreshes, focus loss, or tab-hidden events recorded.

How to read this

What the signals mean

Page refresh, window blur (focus lost), and tab hidden are each recorded with a timestamp. A single event is usually normal nerves or a slip. Clusters of events, and long gaps mid-answer, are the pattern to watch.

When a session is flagged

BEST flags a session only once activity passes a threshold — for example, three or more refreshes, or several focus-loss events. One blur at minute three is noise, not a verdict.

Flags are evidence, not verdicts

A flag opens a human review of the session recording. It never fails a candidate automatically. Always read the score and the integrity log together — a strong score from a flagged session is the one to check first.
